RSV Symptom Reminders

Symptoms of RSV (respiratory syncytial virus) infection include:

- Runny nose and nasal congestion (stuffy nose)
- Sore throat
- Decrease in appetite (not hungry)
- Coughing
- Fever
- Sneezing
- Breathing difficulties or wheezing

If your child experiences any of these symptoms, he/she may have RSV and could be eligible for the CROCUS research study of an investigational medication for children with RSV.
